The first group was a team of doctors & nurses from USA, Hawaii and American Samoa. They travel to Samoa on an annual basis. Their mission is to run a medical clinic on both islands of Samoa, all free of charge. People from the villages came for free consultation and were given free medication and services. A special tent was set up as a prayer room. Here, many gave their lives to Jesus. Dan & I and a team from church worked as volunteers for the whole day assisting with translation and other support duties.



We started our new roles at the Bible College in August. Dan was appointed the role of 'Dean of Students' – a pastoral role and oversees the daily running of school life. I am currently working as the School Administrator, trying to set up office systems and looking after school library☺. I will assist with in the running of our new computer class and will eventually do some teaching here at the school. In such a short time, God has knitted our hearts with the students and the staff.
